#### **Continuing French Immersion Studies**

This curriculum is designed for students who, during their elementary school education, opted for French Immersion studies. In following this curriculum, students have the opportunity to earn a Bilingual High School Diploma upon graduation.

#### **Second Language Option**

Students in this group continue to take all their courses in English but have four periods a week of either French or Spanish language instruction. It is anticipated that they will also complete Grade 12 French or Spanish while in Grade 10.

#### A UNIQUE BILINGUAL PROGRAM

WITH A GLOBAL UNDERSTANDING OF
MULTILINGUALISM AND CULTURAL DIVERSITY

Does the thought of having the ability to communicate with people from different origins and backgrounds excite you? WIC's French Immersion program will expose you to languages through a variety of life experiences. We want you to be confident when travelling, to engage in authentic interactions with individuals whose native language is different from your own, to become aware of your cultural identity, and to achieve your career goals by being able to compete confidently in a multilingual market.

The WIC Bilingual Diploma is awarded to those students who have successfully completed 35 credits of study in which the language of instruction was French, one DELF Diploma (B1 or B2), the FSL 30 Challenge Exam, the AP French Language & Culture, and who have earned a West Island College Graduation Diploma.



# FRENCH & SPANISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE (FSL & SSL)

Second-language learning provides significant cognitive and academic benefits. It is known to enhance first-language and overall literacy skills as well as provide a foundation for the learning of additional languages. Since its inception as *Travel Studies* in the early 1990s, WIC's International Studies program has sent more than a thousand student travellers abroad. Each year, over Spring Break, the program aims to revisit its sustainable humanitarianism and conservation efforts and continues to add new and exciting destinations.


### DRAMATIC ARTS VISUAL ARTS

As a Grade 10 student, you will head out on a three-day program at Camp Chief Hector to prepare you for your Grade 11 and 12 options where you will choose from alpine hiking, scuba diving, canoeing, mountaineering, mountain biking, or day trips.
